## **Declaration of principle Supply Chain Due Diligence Act**

Responsibility for the implementation of this declaration of principles is managed by the Managing Director of the Group and the divisional heads of the business units. This ensures that every area of our company is aware of its own responsibility for respecting human rights and implementing them on a daily basis.

To comply with international human rights standards, national laws and Mediahuis Aachen's policies, we conduct appropriate human rights and environmental due diligence to identify, assess and address potential and actual adverse impacts in our business activities and supply chain.

If it is determined that there is a risk that our business activities are causing or contributing to adverse impacts on human rights or the environment, we have a process in place to assess, modify, discontinue and/or correct the activity. We encourage our employees to report suspected violations of this Human Rights Policy through existing grievance or dispute resolution procedures. This includes local management and the relevant HR department.
